

Fees and Billing

- ◆ Parents contract with CCCC to provide their requested schedule of childcare. A two-week notice for changes or termination of childcare services is required for refunds or prorated charges.
- ◆ For information on the cost of care for a flexible schedule that meets your needs, please contact the individual centers.
- ◆ CCCC offers limited childcare subsidies and scholarships to qualifying families through grants supplied by the United Way and the City of Corvallis.
- ◆ Discounts for multiple children from the same family are available.
- ◆ CCCC families coordinate several fundraisers each year that contribute to operating budget for the centers.

Flexible scheduling allows parents to choose full-day or half-day care, five days per week. Additional options are available, space permitting.

Located on the west side of Oregon State University this center is accredited by the NAEYC. Operated through a contract with OSU, the center's primary function is to serve children of OSU students, faculty, and staff, but accepts community families when space is available. Services

CCCC provides a safe, nurturing environment where children are encouraged to be independent and to learn to their full potential.



Programs include:

- ◆ A flexible daily schedule that includes art, science, math, and literacy activities, free choice time, music and movement, sensory projects, outside games, and circle time.
- ◆ Special events such as field trips and bookmobile visits.
- ◆ Strong parent involvement. Parents are welcome to visit their child's center at any time.
- ◆ A USDA-funded food program through the Oregon Department of Education offering nutritious breakfasts, lunches and snacks. "USDA and the State of Oregon are equal opportunity providers and employers."
- ◆ Individual schedules for infants and support for nursing mothers.
- ◆ Referrals to other community programs when applicable.
- ◆ Limited resources to assist families with childcare expenses.
